

Beginning on Respect Life Sunday, the first Sunday in October, our nation's Catholics will be called to renew their personal commitment to defend ALL human life.

Catholic teaching on the death penalty begins with the recognition that the dignity of the human person applies to everyone. It affirms our commitment to comfort and support victims and their families, to protect society while acknowledging the God-given dignity of every human life, even those who do great harm.

Respect for truly innocent human life can be enhanced by respecting the essential worth of people convicted of capital crimes. Every refusal to kill affirms the dignity of all human life.

This Respect Life Month Toolkit is designed to assist your parish, school, or community consider the sanctity of all life with regards to the issue of the death penalty. In the words of our bishops, "We seek to help build a culture of life in which our nation will no longer try to teach that killing is wrong by killing those who kill. This cycle of violence diminishes all of us."








Pray




Holy Hour of Mercy



The culture of life we seek is built on a foundation of prayer. The Holy Hour of Mercy is a resource that guides you through an hour of praying for life and an end to the death penalty. Prayers in this hour include the St. Michael Prayer, The Divine Mercy Chaplet, and a Litany for Life. This guided holy hour can be used to lead a group in a prayer service for and an end to the Death Penalty or can be used by an individual during a personal holy hour.
