WHAT IS THE IGNATIANT FAMILY TEACH-IN FOR JUSTICE?

The Ignatian Family Teach-In for Justice (IFTJ) is an annual gathering for 2,000+ members of the Jesuit and greater Catholic network to come together in the context of social justice and solidarity to learn, reflect, pray, network, and advocate. It is a place where people are empowered, re-energized, inspired, challenged, and supported by a community that sees faith and justice integrally linked.

Through keynote presentations, breakout sessions, and networking opportunities, attendees spend the first two days of the conference deepening their understanding of social justice issues, including but not limited to: immigration, racial equity, gun violence, poverty, human rights, etc. On the final day of the gathering, nearly 1,500 participants head to Capitol Hill to advocate for 1-2 core issues; this year focusing on humane migration reform and care for creation.

Now in its 21st year, IFTJ has a rich history rooted in honoring the Jesuits and their companions who were martyred in El Salvador in 1989.
